# 1. Call to Order

Abby Conroy, Land Use Administrator (LUA) Members Absent:

LUA Conroy called the meeting to order at 9:05 am recognizing the meeting as a joint assembly
between the Salisbury Planning and Zoning Commission (PZC) and the Salisbury Inland Wetlands and
Watercourse Commission (IWWC). She indicated all meetings will be considered special meetings.

### 2. Attendance

15 The presence of Peter Neely of IWWC, Vivian Garfein of IWWC, Debra Allee of PZC, Cathy Shyer of 16 PZC, Maria Grace of IWWC, LUA Abby Conroy and Dr. Michael Klemens of PZC was acknowledged.

# 3. Introductions

The commissioners gave a brief introduction of their backgrounds.

Vivian Garfein specified she was one of the newest members of the IWWC Commission and a recent full-time resident of Lakeville. She has practiced law for 30 years and previously worked for the Florida Department Environmental Protection as litigation attorney, a bureau chief for surface water management and a district director for Central Florida.

Dr. Michael Klemens has a background in ecology and conservation biology and is on the staff of the American Museum of Natural History in New York City. He has also worked for the Wildlife Conservation Society and has extensively studied wetlands and their importance to the landscape and has authored numerous publications. He is currently the Chairman of the PZC, residing in Lakeville.

Peter Neely has a long history with the town of Salisbury and has resided here for many years. He has a background as an English major both teaching and as administrator and is now retired. Much of his land in Salisbury, where he resides, is wetlands and is a major tributary to the East Twin Lake. He participates in monthly water testing for the East Twin Lake and contributes much of this data with the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection. He currently serves on IWWC as a regular member.

Debra Allee has a background in environmental impact statements and started the firm AKRF in
New York City. Much of her work has been in urban areas and she met Dr. Michael Klemens in
Montauk New York years ago working on a development project. She has an extensive background
dealing with urban, suburban, and rural wetlands. She currently serves on the PZC as an alternate.

39 Maria Grace studied environmental science at the New Jersey School of Conservation. She has 40 run several educational programs on river ecology for youth and worked for the Conserve Wildlife 41 Foundation in New Jersey for 10 years. In 2014 she moved to Northwest corner where she worked for 42 Sharon Audubon, Housatonic Valley Association and is now the executive director of the Sharon Land 43 Trust. In 2018 she moved to Salisbury serving on the IWWC commission as a regular member. 44 Cathy Shyer move to the states 30 years ago with her husband and in 1998 moved to Lakeville. 45 For many years she worked with the Wononscopomuc Lake Association in Lakeville and dealt with 46 many IWWC and PZC issues. She has been a Commissioner on the PZC since 2017 and has recently 47 become the Vice-Chair. 48 49 4. Election of Officers 50 Dr. Michael Klemens proposed a nomination of Vivian Garfein for Chairman of the Commission 51 Cathy Shyer second the nomination and she accepted. 52 53 *Motion*: To elect Vivian Garfein for the Chair of the joint Commission. 54 Made by Klemens, seconded by Shyer 55 Vote: 6-0-0. 56 57 Dr. Michael Klemens proposed a nomination of Peter Neely for Vice-Chair of the joint 58 Commission. Cathy Shyer seconded the nomination and he accepted. 59 60 *Motion*: To elect Peter Neely for the Vice-Chair position of the joint Commission. 61 Made by Klemens, seconded by Shyer 62 Vote: 6-0-0. 63 64 5. Organization of Topics & Tasks 65 Chairman Garfein initiated the conversation on organization of topics & tasks she indicated Vice Chair Neely and herself have both reviewed the PZC regulations and LUA Conroy provided a list as a 66 starting point. She inquired if Commissioners had any considerations or additions. 67 68 LUA Conroy begin with the topic of *clearing* she recognized the need to follow up with Darcy Winther of DEEP and Janet Brooks, attorney for IWWC, for recommendations on *clearing* definitions. 69 70 LUA Conroy spoke to the meaning of the *ordinary high watermark* noting it is used in both 71 regulations however has different definitions. She added Dr. Klemens, in his PZC Chairman capacity had 72 given ecological/biological suggestions and draft language for an improved definition. She also 73 suggested including definitions for fens, vernal pools, high gradient streams and head water streams as 74 the IWWC is considering a resource-based approach to their Upland Review Area. 75 LUA Conroy also expressed a need to have a public guidance document to define and explain 76 the different jurisdictions including *setbacks*, upland review areas, buffers and regulated areas. She specified that IWWC has also requested a definition for *declaratory ruling* which is a
statutory exemption to wetland permitting that must go before the IWWC Commission before it is
deemed exempt.

LUA Conroy also mentioned the issue of *docks* as both Commissions frequently see this topicbefore them.

Commissioner Shyer requested an explanation as to the overall goal of this this Commission.
LUA Conroy responded that much of the objective is to address conflicting terms as well as clarifying
and streamlining the process between the two Commissions. There is some overlap in jurisdiction
which can be confusing to both the public and Commissioners alike.

Chair Garfein noted that IWWC is changing and updating their regulations and many of the definitions need to be updated. She noticed many overlaps between the two Commissions and hopes clarification will lessen the pushback to these changes. She suggested tackling *ordinary high watermark* in the next meeting as the PZC has one definition but the term is undefined in the wetlands regulations. She also suggested trying to tackle jurisdiction and buffer definitions as they are priority.

Commissioner Klemens acknowledged the need to distinguish between buffer, setbacks, upland review areas and regulated areas as this would help to clarify the disconnect between the jurisdictions of the Commissions. He also urged the Commissioners to examine what it is they are trying to protect, asking what are these important values, and which activities can be "as of right".

95 Commissioner Shyer queried the stance of IWWC on ordinance and fines for violation? The 96 Chair responded that IWWC has no consensus within the Commission but does have a will for more 97 enforcement. LUA Conroy identified the Town of Salisbury does not have the right to fine and would 98 need to establish an ordinance to do so.

Commissioner Grace reiterated the need for clarification of definitions stating it can be
extremely confusing even with a scientific background and would be beneficial for all parties involved.
She opined that many people conduct activities without permits because regulations can be
ambiguous.

103 Commissioner Allee voiced concern that many times the commissions focus on the lakes and 104 not on streams and watercourses. Commissioner Klemens noted that the lake issues give good 105 community feedback, and more thought and work is needed regarding regulated activities. He noted 106 that authority needs to be clearly defined adding every case is different and no property is ecologically 107 isolated. He stressed regulations should not just be restrictive but also provide incentives.

108 Vice Chair Neely identified the issue with "as of right", expressing that many people interpret 109 this as a right endowed and not as activities to be reviewed by the Commissions then deemed 110 appropriate. The Commission agreed that "as of right" activities need to be defined accurately and 111 should consider the possibility of adding/listing exempt activities within these categories. It was agreed 112 that regulations should cover State statutes of definitions even if there are more than one. They 113 acknowledged the necessity to be written in a manner that can be easily understood and defended in 114 court.

115 The Commission discussed public education and participation. It was acknowledged that groups 116 like the lake associations play a vital role in public outreach. LUA Conroy recognized that legal counsel 117 for both the PZC and IWWC did not recommend public participation until the Commission reaches a 118 consensus of recommendations.
