Survey (15)

A one-time tax of 2 percent, for example, would be paid by the buyer of real estate in the Town of Salisbury; the first \$250,000, for example, would be exempt from the real estate transfer fee. The revenue from the tax would be put into a dedicated Town

- fund for preserving open space and creating affordable housing, initiatives that need not be mutually exclusive. This "concrete step," which has precedents in such towns as East Hampton, NY, would be an important milestone in addressing the quality of life in Salisbury.
