



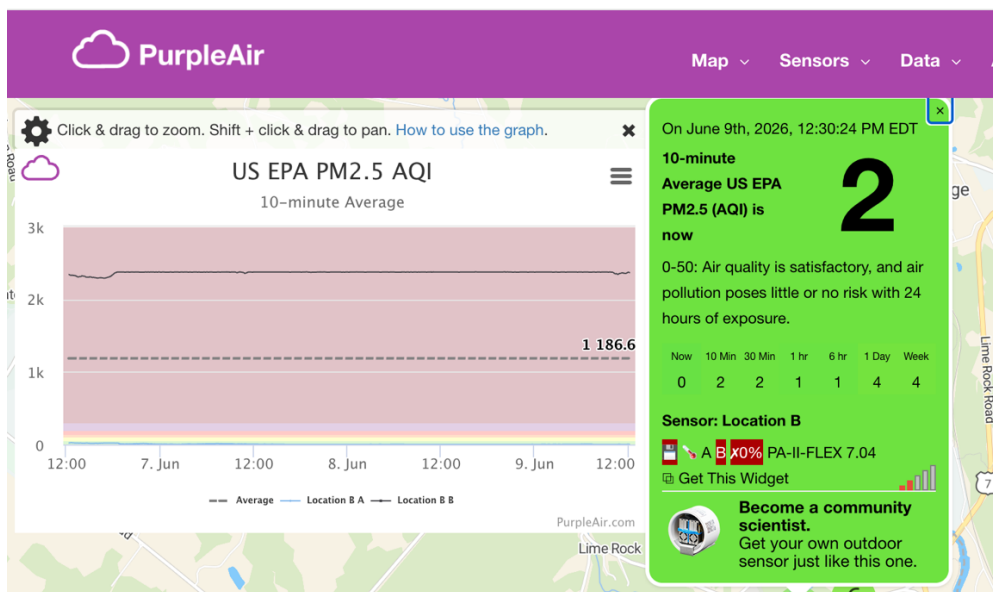

To the Commission:

Thank you for your ongoing efforts as the Lime Rock Citizens Council and Lime Rock Park collectively seek to have the Amended Stipulated Judgement from May 12, 2026 adopted into the Town of Salisbury Regulations. As previously stated, we believe the changes reflect the current interests of both the community and Lime Rock Park.

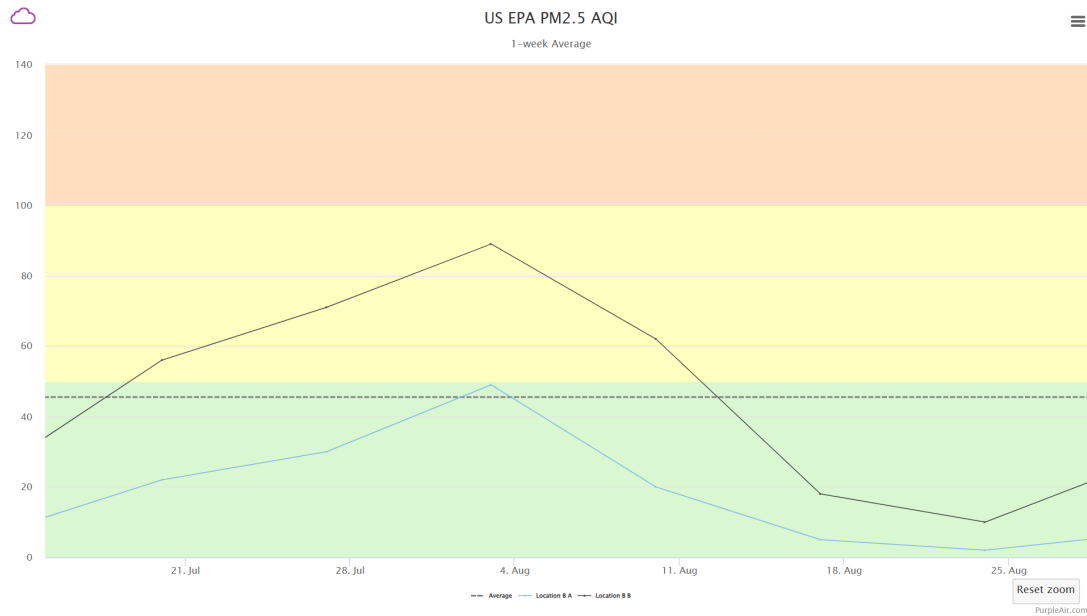
During the PZC hearing on Monday June 1, as a part of the conversation regarding the single, limited, drifting demonstration allowed in the Stipulated Agreement, Lime Rock Park was asked to provide information regarding the Air Quality Monitoring process and devices in place at the Park.

In 2024 in conjunction with its LRCC conversations, Lime Rock Park voluntarily installed two State of CT approved air quality monitoring devices on its property. One is located near the White Hollow Rd. entrance, and the other near the Track Office on Route 112. Both monitoring devices feed data to “Purple Air “and directly to the State of Connecticut. Here is a screen shot of one of the installed devices, showing current conditions:



Since installation, Lime Rock Park has never been notified by the State of any abnormal or elevated readings that would be inconsistent with other device readings from around the State.

The Park has also gone back to data from last year during the GRIDLIFE event from August 15-17, 2025. As the Commission can see, there were no anomalies from that time period either. In fact, the data shows that there was a smaller “spike” in the reading from August 3-4, when there was no track activity August 3, and a lightly-attended school event on August 4.



The Lime Rock Citizens Council and Lime Rock Park ask that the Salisbury Planning and Zoning Commission amend its regulations to conform to all the changes agreed to by the parties and as approved by the CT Superior Court.
